Mission Action Plan - Parish consultation in January

As part of our Mission Month, we are going to try and find out what people who don't come to St Mary's think. We would like every member of the congregation to have a conversation with a neighbour or friend who lives in the parish asking them what they want from St Mary's as their local church. Once you have had your conversation either put the key comments in an email to the Rector with "Parish Consultation" in the subject line, or write it on one of the yellow sheets at the back and drop it in to the Parish Office.

NEW ELECTORAL ROLL

A new Church electoral roll has to be prepared. If you wish to be included on the new roll you <u>must</u> complete and return an application form <u>even if you were included on the old roll</u>. Forms are available at the cross aisles and will also be sent by email to those on the old roll for whom the Church has email contact details. The closing date for applications will be 13 March. However it would be helpful if completed forms could be submitted by **21 February** as, following that date, it will be necessary to post a form to anyone on the old roll who has not yet submitted an application and for whom the Church has no email contact details.

Bishop Gilpin C of E Primary School

Is currently consulting on proposed changes to its Admissions Arrangements for the 2020/2021 academic year. As has been widely reported in the media, teacher recruitment and retention is now a top priority for the government. In order to secure and retain high quality teachers, Merton Local Authority has amended its Admissions Policy to give priority to children of permanent teaching staff. Increasingly, church primary schools, within the Diocese of Southwark are also

adopting this approach. In order for Bishop Gilpin to continue to retain and attract the highest quality staff, the governors consider that it is appropriate for our current Admissions Policy to be amended to reflect this trend. It is therefore proposed that priority is given to children of members of staff who are employed on a permanent contract with the school and who have at least two years service at the time of application. This will be limited to a maximum of two places per year.

The Governors consider that this approach will enable the school to continue to be an attractive proposition to high calibre staff whilst minimising disadvantage to local families. The proposed new policy for admissions is available to view on the school website at www.bishopgilpin.org, under the Admissions section. The consultation period will run until 25 January 2019.
