Experiences of Choral Evensong survey

The University of Oxford's Faculty of Music is undertaking a three-year, Arts and Humanities Research Council-funded project to investigate the ways in which people experience Choral Evensong in 21st-century Britain. Inspired by the growing numbers of people reportedly attending Choral Evensong in many - though not all - of the churches where it is regularly held, the survey is asking: who is going? Why? What do they experience when they are there?
