It is also helpful to attach a photograph of you and your child. Ensuring you are on the Church's Electoral Roll, (this is not the same as the one for Local and General Elections) is also helpful. Reference forms should be given in at the Parish Office marked FAO The Rector. Please ensure any envelopes for returning the forms to schools have stamps on them.

Following lockdown in March it will be assumed that you would have attended church as you had been in the habit of doing while church services were suspended or ticketed. When we are writing references attendance will be taken into account from the normal resumption of services on the 5th September, 2020.

PCC Treasurer Wanted - Volunteer

The PCC needs a new Treasurer. The PCC Treasurer will work closely with the Parish Finance Officer (a new paid book keeping roll) to oversee the finances of the team, to ensure that the parish complies with its duties and obligations as a registered charity and to enable the members of the PCC to discharge their responsibilities at Trustees through having a good understanding of the financial situation of the parish and the financial implications of the decisions they are making. Parish Finance Officer – Part Time Paid Role

The PCC wants to appoint a part time parish finance officer on an 18-month contract to join us as soon as possible following a recent review of our structure and operations. The person taking up this role will have an opportunity to make a real impact on the Parish's financial management which supports our mission and purpose and as we look beyond the impact of COVID-19 and the

lockdowns of 2020. We envisage that this role will be about 3 days per week, fully flexible, but on site in the Parish Office to best support team activity. The role will be suited to a qualified, experienced accountant with some interest in, or possibly prior experience of, the charity sector.
